

## How to Apply for Federation Funding

The Jewish Federation of Broward County provides funding through an RRP (Request for Proposals) process once each year. Agencies seeking funding, should ask to have their names and contact information added to the list of agencies that will be contacted when the Federation issues its RFP in early November each year. Agencies wishing to apply for funding must complete all required forms, and submit all required documents by the RFP due date (generally very early February or late January.) Not all agencies or programs which submit proposals will be funded, as funding is limited and this is a highly competitive process. Those agencies that are funded may not receive the full amount of their request.

Funding provided in response to proposals submitted through the RFP process, is for the next fiscal year, which starts July 1. Depending on the type, size, and location of your program, funding may be provided by check or ACH payment monthly (in 12 payments) or quarterly (in 4 payments), or during a specific time of the year (for programs that do not run year-round), or on a reimbursement basis.

The Jewish Federation of Broward County funds programs, and does not fund general operating expenses. Programs are selected based on how closely they meet impact team established priorities, quality, and impact.

The Federation is looking for the most impactful possible programs, provided by responsible, established agencies, that can provide all necessary documentation, function with fiscal responsibility, and **prove** their impact. Showing us that a need exists is not enough; you must show us that you are the very best way to meet that need, and that your program is the very best way to spend limited dollars.
